To the best of our knowledge, implemented policies/procedures and/or written assurance from our suppliers, Aspire Designs Limited states that the diamonds have not been obtained in violation and / or sanctions by the US departments of Treasury's office of foreign assets control (OFAC) and have not been originated from the MBADA and Marange resources of Zimbabwe. To the best of our knowledge and/or written assurance from our suppliers, we state that diamonds are exclusively of natural origin and untreated and are not sourced from artisanal mines. Aspire Designs Limited, has a synthetic diamond testing technology and all the diamonds are checked in the testing machines for the surety of natural diamonds. The diamonds comply with the requirements of the WFDB charter on disclosure of synthetic, treated natural and natural diamonds.
