He currently sits on the board of the Canadian Jewellers Association (CJA) and the Canadian Diamond Code of Conduct (CDCC). As LKI's corporate compliance and social responsibility officer, he attended the inaugural KP meeting at Kimberley, RSA in May 2000, developed LKI's zero tolerance policy against conflict diamonds,

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directs LKI's AML/CFT programs consistent with USA PATRIOT Act provisions, and coordinates LKI's conflict minerals reporting under relevant provisions of the US Dodd-Frank Act. Under his direction, (1) Lazare Kaplan Puerto Rico became the world's first diamond factory certified compliant with SA8000 social accountability standards, (2) LKI's group entities have been rated "compliant" since inception of De Beers BPPs, and (3) LKI's global operations were certified RJC compliant.
