Since January 2023, each diamond that has been inscribed with the Forevermark inscription is sourced from De Beers' managed and joint venture operations in Botswana, Canada, Namibia and South Africa, and has been responsibly manufactured by entities compliant with the De Beers Best Practice Principles and that have compliant management systems in place to track and trace these diamonds from rough purchase through to inscription, under the assurance and governance of the proprietary De Beers Diamond Pipeline Integrity Specification (DPIS). Prior to January 2023, each diamond that had been inscribed with the Forevermark inscription was sourced from a handful of carefully selected mines and producers.

Diamonds with the Code of Origin inscription originate from De Beers' managed and joint venture operations in Botswana, Canada, Namibia and South Africa and have been responsibly manufactured by entities compliant with the De Beers Best Practice Principles and that have compliant management systems in place to track and trace these diamonds from rough purchase through to inscription, under the assurance and governance of the proprietary (DPIS).

GemFair sources diamonds from artisanal and small-scale miners in Sierra Leone in accordance with the GemFair Programme and registers eligible GemFair diamonds on Tracr.
