Scope of Rio Tinto certification for the Responsible Jewellery Council

This letter is provided to you in connection with KPMG's Certification Recommendation & Summary Report for the year ended 31 December 2011.

Rio Tinto's certification scope comprises those entities that (i) are under its control and (ii) actively contribute to the gold and diamond jewellery supply chain, being Rio Tinto London Limited, Argyle Diamonds Limited, Diavik Diamond Mines Inc, Murowa Diamonds (Private) Ltd, Kennecott Utah Copper LLC and Rio Tinto Diamonds NV.

Neither the Bunder Diamond Project nor the Oyu Tolgoi Project has been included because they have not yet commenced commercial production.

Rio Tinto wishes to reassure the Responsible Jewellery Council ("RJC") that both its Bunder Diamond Project and Oyu Tolgoi Project are being developed in accordance with responsible ethical, social and environmental practices which respect human rights, in line with Rio Tinto's own internal policies and processes. These policies and processes are themselves aligned with the RJC's Code of Practices.

Rio Tinto will review the inclusion of these projects within the certification scope to the extent that in due course they enter commercial production for the purposes of the certification. Should it become apparent that commercial production would commence at either of these projects prior to 31 December 2012, we will re-assess our current certification scope accordingly.
