The diamonds herein invoiced are neither recycled nor sourced from artisanally mined and it is exclusive of natural origin, formed and grown under natural and geological process, synthetic free, earth mined and untreated except otherwise stated. The diamonds are compliant with the relevant WFDB charter on disclosure of synthetic, treated natural and natural diamonds, for the diamond and gold, platinum group metals. The seller warrants that the diamonds supplied are in compliance with the Signet Responsible Sourcing Protocol (SRSP).
