Fair Trade Jewellery Co. sources diamonds from Canada, as part of the Canada Mark program. Fair Trade Jewellery Co. sources post-consumer recycled diamonds from a SCS certified Responsible Source supplier. Fair Trade Jewellery Co. sources diamonds from Canada, as part of the Canadian Diamond Code of Conduct program. Fair Trade Jewellery Co. sources diamonds from Canada that are accompanied by a government of Ontario certificate. Fair Trade Jewellery Co. sources diamonds from Canada, based on written assurances from our suppliers. Fair Trade Jewellery Co., sources diamonds from the Argyle Mine in Australia based on certificates and written assurances from their suppliers.
